Importance of Inference?

What is an inference? Any conclusion we draw from given information

Communicator Implies, Received Infers

"All reasoning contains inferences or interpretations by which we draw conclusions and given meaning to data."

Richard Paul, Linda Elder, Miniature Guide to Critical Thinking

**Are Implications Binding?** 

Context must determine – not all conclusions are equal

**Examples** 

Why are you a Christian today?

What is the "Greatest Commandment"?

What about "things like these"? (Gal. 5:19-21)
Discerning good and evil (Heb. 5:12-14)
Jesus' expectations (Matt. 22:23-33; Mark 7)
Implications in Ten Commandments



Jesus as High Priest, and necessity of change in Law (Heb. 7:12-14)

Recognizing the Messiah (John 5:39)



Hand in hand with examples

Principle: fundamental truth from which other laws or behaviors are derived.

What about abuses?

Deal with the abuse, but don't denigrate the communication process.
