

### Some Things We Think We Need Or Want Are Not Good For Us

- Some don't want to be bothered with God requiring them to be obedient.
- Some, when in trial, decide to quit and want others to leave them alone.
- Those rebuked for sin often feel they would be happier if left alone.
- We want to consider what a mess we would be in if God decided to do what we want and let us have our own way.

#### Hosea 4:1 - 5:10 - Ephraimites

- 4:1-2 There is no truth, knowledge of God, nor mercy in the land. They sin and keep on sinning.
- 4:3-5 All of the people, priests, and even the land would be cursed.
- 4:6-9 They rejected knowledge of God and His way
- 4:10-11 They would eat, but not be satisfied, because they sought things to satisfy their own lusts and idolatries.
- 4:12-14 They pursued idolatry, and God ceased to reprove them any longer.
- 4:16-17 He would "Let Ephraim alone" in their determination to continue to sin.
- 5:1-2 He rebuked Israel and they would not listen.
- 5:3-5 They shall both fall in their iniquity.
- 5:6-10 He would now pour out His wrath on them.

- Matt. 15:12-14 Pharisees
  - Matt 3:7 They didn't listen to John's warnings.
  - Matt. 21:23-27 Many disregarded
    John's teachings.
  - Mark 3:22 They attributed Jesus' healing to the work of the Devil.
  - Mark 3:6 They plotted to kill Him.
  - Matt. 15:3-9 They held traditions above the word of God.

- Rom. 1:20-32 Gentiles
  - -1:20-23 They refused to remember and accept God.
  - -1:24 God gave them up to immorality.
  - 1:26-27 God gave them up to homosexuality.
  - -1:28-32 God gave them up to a reprobate mind.

- Rom. 1:20-28 Gentiles
- How did they end up?
  - They were fools, though they thought themselves wise.
  - They were religious but their worship was vain before God.
  - They wallowed in their own lusts, in bondage to the worst of sins, in a lifestyle they thought was freedom.
  - They filled their lives with trouble, certain they were managing their lives well.
  - They earned of death, but they refused to see it.

- Heb 6:4-9 Apostate Christians
  - -6:4-6 They tasted all the good blessings God has to offer and then fell away, leaving the blessings for something else they cherished more.
  - It is impossible to renew them again to repentance, as there is nothing left with which to reach them.
  - 6:7-9 They stand hopeless and despised before God.

- We make the very flawed assumption that everyone can be saved.
  - Jesus said otherwise "Pearls before swine" (Matt. 7:6)
  - Paul said otherwise "God gave them up" (Rom. 1:26)
  - Peter said otherwise "The latter end is worse for them than the beginning" (2Peter 2:20)
  - The Hebrew writer said otherwise "It is impossible... to renew them again to repentance" (Heb. 6:4, 6); "There no longer remains a sacrifice for sins" (Heb. 10:26)
- Many cannot be saved or restored. They have the "reprobate" or debased mind.

## Why Would God Let These People Have Their Own Way?

- In each case, there was ample opportunity to listen to God's warnings and repent.
- In each case, the people followed their own desires and rejected God's way for a way of their own choosing.
- In such cases, there comes a point when God will not try further.

## Why Would God Let These People Have Their Own Way?

- Prov. 1:20-33 What does wisdom do if its cry is not heard?
  - -1:20-22 Wisdom cries out.
  - -1:23 Wisdom makes one last call.
  - -1:24-25 They repeatedly refuse to listen.
  - -1:26-31 They will taste the fruit of their mistakes.
  - -1:32-33 Their judgment is self-inflicted.

- He first shows the way through His Son.
  - Heb. 1:1 He has done this.
  - John1:10-12 He was the light that men have rejected.
  - -John 3:18-21 Lack of faith in Him is condemned because it is a result of rejecting the light.
  - John 16:13 All Truth will be revealed by the Spirit.
  - 2Peter 1:3 All that pertains to life and godliness has been given.

- He then earnestly exhorts us to receive this message.
  - Acts 2:38-40 Exhortation was given to them.
  - Acts 3:19 Repent and be converted.
  - -James 1:21-22 Be doers, receive the saving word.
  - Matt. 7:24-27 Be wise, not foolish.

- He sternly warns us of the consequences of refusing to hear.
  - Rom. 10:16 Counted as an unbeliever
  - 2Thes. 1:7-9 Fiery vengeance of God
  - Matt. 13:41-42 Cast out of the kingdom
  - 1Peter 4:17-19 Judgment is coming

- He will be patient.
  - 2Peter 3:14-15 His longsuffering is for our salvation.
  - 2Peter 3:9 His longsuffering allows the world to stand.

- He will reprove and correct us if we will listen.
  - 2Tim. 3:16 Doctrine, reproof, correction, and instruction in righteousness.
  - Heb. 12:11 "Chastening... yields the peaceable fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it."

- And then He will bring certain judgment on us if we still want to have our own way.
  - Heb. 10:27 "A certain fearful expectation of judgment"
  - Deut. 9:3 "The LORD your God is... a consuming fire."
  - 2Peter 2:4-9 He has done it before.
