The Bible Plan for Personal Peace

 - Prov. 3:1-2 - “My son, do not forget my law, But let your heart keep my commands; 2 For length of days and long life And peace they will add to you.”

The Bible Plan for Personal Peace

- Psalm 4:6-8 - “There are many who say, ‘Who will show us any good?’ LORD, lift up the light of Your countenance upon us. 7 You have put gladness in my heart, More than in the season that their grain and wine increased. 8 I will both lie down in peace, and sleep; For You alone, O LORD, make me dwell in safety.”

The Bible Plan for Personal Peace

- Psalm 37:11, 37 - “But the meek shall inherit the earth, And shall delight themselves in the abundance of peace... 37 Mark the blameless man, and observe the upright; For the future of that man is peace.”
- Isa. 26:3 - “You will keep him in perfect peace, Whose mind is stayed on You, Because he trusts in You.”
- John 16:33 - “These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world.”

The Bible Plan for Personal Peace

- “Life is supposed to be fair.”
- Job 1:20-22 - “Then Job arose, tore his robe, and shaved his head; and he fell to the ground and worshiped. 21 And he said: ‘Naked I came from my mother's womb, And naked shall I return there. The LORD gave, and the LORD has taken away; Blessed be the name of the LORD.’”

Things Persons At Peace Refuse To Believe

- “Suffering is bad.”
- James 1:2-4 - “My brethren, count it all joy when you fall into various trials, 3 knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience. 4 But let patience have its perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing.”

Things Persons At Peace Refuse To Believe

- “I’m in control of everything in my life.”
- Phil. 1:12-14 - “But I want you to know, brethren, that the things which happened to me have actually turned out for the furtherance of the gospel, 13 so that it has become evident to the whole palace guard, and to all the rest, that my chains are in Christ; 14 and most of the brethren in the Lord, having become confident by my chains, are much more bold to speak the word without fear.”

Things Persons At Peace Refuse To Believe

- “People should love me the way I want to be loved.”
- Mark 12:42-44 - “Then one poor widow came and threw in two mites, which make a quadrans. 43 So He called His disciples to Himself and said to them, Assuredly, I say to you that this poor widow has put in more than all those who have given to the treasury; 44 for they all put in out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty put in all that she had, her whole livelihood.”

Things Persons At Peace Refuse To Believe

- “Everyone hates me.”
- 1Kings 19:14, 18 - “And he said, ‘I have been very zealous for the LORD God of hosts; because the children of Israel have forsaken Your covenant, torn down Your altars, and killed Your prophets with the sword. I alone am left; and they seek to take my life...’ 18 ‘Yet I have reserved seven thousand in Israel, all whose knees have not bowed to Baal, and every mouth that has not kissed him.’”
- 2Tim. 4:16-17 - “At my first defense no one stood with me, but all forsook me. May it not be charged against them. 17 But the Lord stood with me and strengthened me, so that the message might be preached fully through me, and that all the Gentiles might hear. And I was delivered out of the mouth of the lion.”

Things Persons At Peace Refuse To Believe

- “I can’t.”
- Num. 13:30-32 - “Then Caleb quieted the people before Moses, and said, ‘Let us go up at once and take possession, for we are well able to overcome it.’ 31 But the men who had gone up with him said, ‘We are not able to go up against the people, for they are stronger than we.’ 32 And they gave the children of Israel a bad report of the land which they had spied out, saying, ‘The land through which we have gone as spies is a land that devours its inhabitants, and all the people whom we saw in it are men of great stature.’”

Things Persons At Peace Refuse To Believe

- “I have something to prove.”
- Acts 24:16 - “This being so, I myself always strive to have a conscience without offense toward God and men.”

- “It doesn’t matter.”
- Prov. 29:25 - “The fear of man brings a snare,
But whoever trusts in the LORD shall be safe.”

Things Persons At Peace Refuse To Believe

- 2Cor. 12:8-9 - “Concerning this thing I pleaded with the Lord three times that it might depart from me. 9 And He said to me, ‘My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness.’ Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.”

Things Persons At Peace Refuse To Believe

- “I’m too old.”
- Joshua 14:10-12 - “And now, behold, the LORD has kept me alive, as He said, these forty-five years, ever since the LORD spoke this word to Moses while Israel wandered in the wilderness; and now, here I am this day, eighty-five years old. 11 As yet I am as strong this day as on the day that Moses sent me; just as my strength was then, so now is my strength for war, both for going out and for coming in. 12 Now therefore, give me this mountain of which the LORD spoke in that day; for you heard in that day how the Anakim were there, and that the cities were great and fortified. It may be that the LORD will be with me, and I shall be able to drive them out as the LORD said.”
