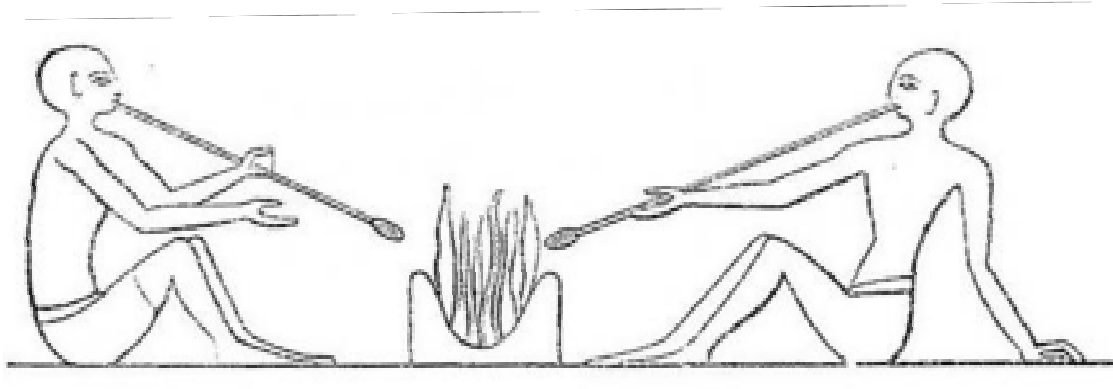

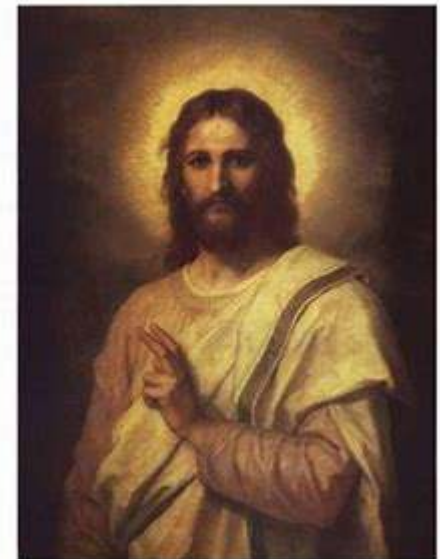
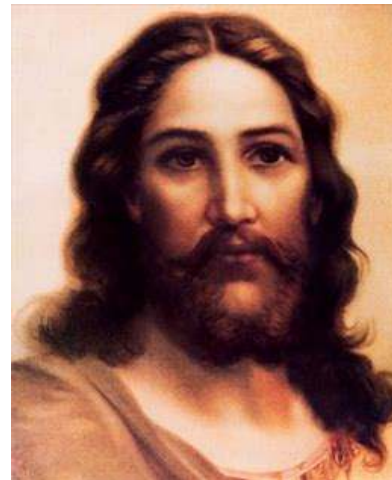
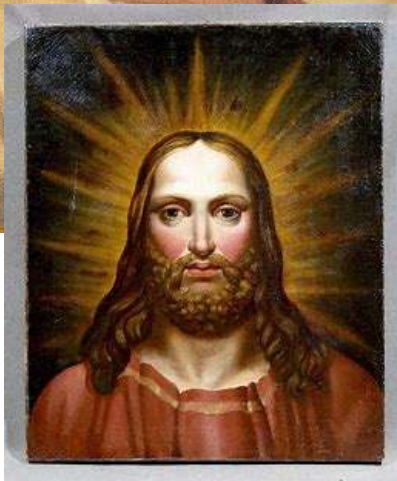
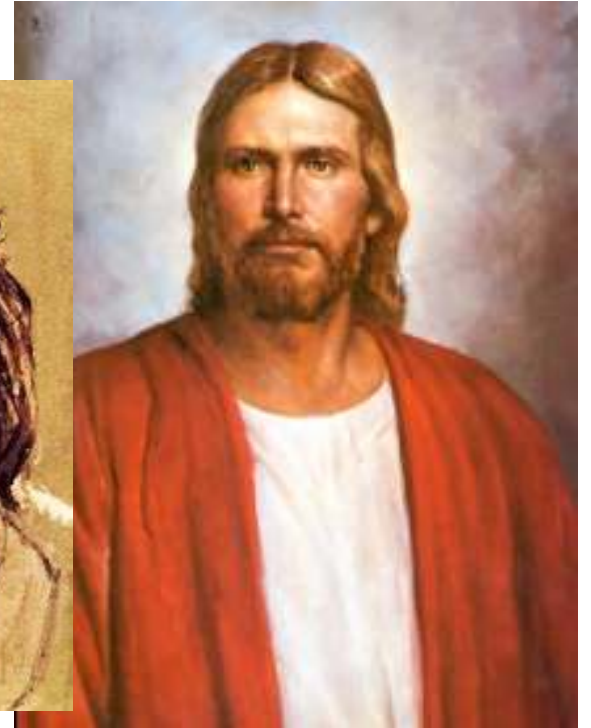
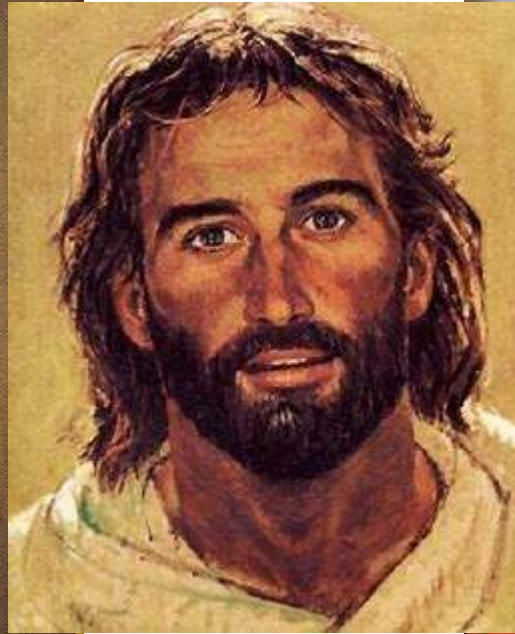
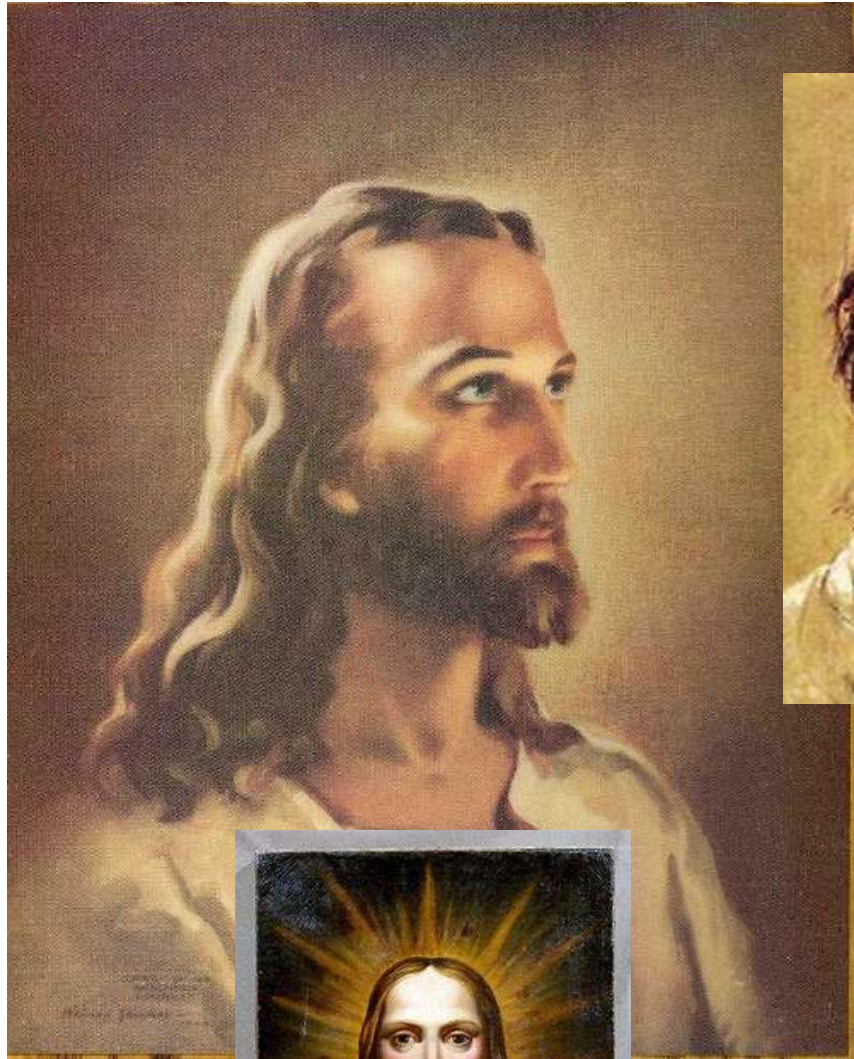
A Gutenberg Bible at the New York Public Library. Bought by James Lenox in 1847, it was the first copy to be acquired by a United States citizen.
