- 15 The dead man sat up and began to speak. And Jesus gave him back to his mother.




















A cave in Machaerus presented as the presumed prison where John the Baptist was kept before beheaded.


- Matthew 25:43

- Luke 3:19-20
- 19 But when Herod the tetrarch was reprimanded by him because of Herodias, his brother's wife, and because of all the wicked things which Herod had done,
- 20 Herod also added this to them all: he locked John up in prison.



- Luke 7:19-20
- 19 And John, calling two of his disciples to him, sent them to Jesus, saying, "Are You the Coming One, or do we look for another?"
- 20 When the men had come to Him, they said, "John the Baptist has sent us to You, saying, 'Are You the Coming One, or do we look for another?"
- John's question doubting Jesus is the Messiah?

- John 1:29-34
- 29 The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!
- 32 And John bore witness, saying, "I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and He remained upon Him.
- 33 I did not know Him, but He who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'Upon whom you see the Spirit descending, and remaining on Him, this is He who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.'
- 34 And I have seen and testified that this is the Son of God."

- Doubt?
- Perplexity the state of being confused because something is difficult to understand
- Not we doubt Jesus
- In perplexity, confusion & discouragement want to know why
- If God so powerful, why can't do something for me?
- When is God going to do something to release me from this prison of pain since He is so powerful?

- Widow done for Jesus so felt obligated to take away her pain?
- John's devotion obvious given life to preparing for Messiah
- Look around took away his pain & her pain – why not do it for me?
- God isn't doing things according to our expectations
- God has everything under control



- Didn't need answers to mysteries of life
- Trust Jesus no matter how confusing the ways of Lord to him

- God always has a reason for doing things His own way
- Why God put so many vitamins in spinach & not in ice cream
- No explanations
- Luke 7:23
- Blessed is anyone who does not stumble on account of me."
- · Just trust Me

- "He was a healthy, robust boy on Tuesday, he got sick on Wednesday & he died on Thursday. You would have liked him – everyone did"
- "It is awful & horrible & sad & no words can comfort his four grandparents, his brother & sister, his friends or his parents"
- "If God had come to you 17 years ago & said, 'I'll make you a bargain - I'll give you a beautiful, wonderful, happy & healthy kid for 17 years & then, I'll take him away,' you would have made that deal in a second.
- And that was the deal we just didn't know the terms"

- John in prison but not because Jesus can't get him out
- God multiplies illustrations of power to control & change circumstances but not for us
- Something better for John
- "No" to John so get infinitely more

- Daniel 3:15-18 (NLT)
- bow down and worship the statue I have made when you hear the sound of the musical instruments. But if you refuse, you will be thrown immediately into the blazing furnace. And then what god will be able to rescue you from my power?"
- 17 If we are thrown into the blazing furnace, the God whom we serve is able to save us. He will rescue us from your power, Your Majesty.
