WISDOM



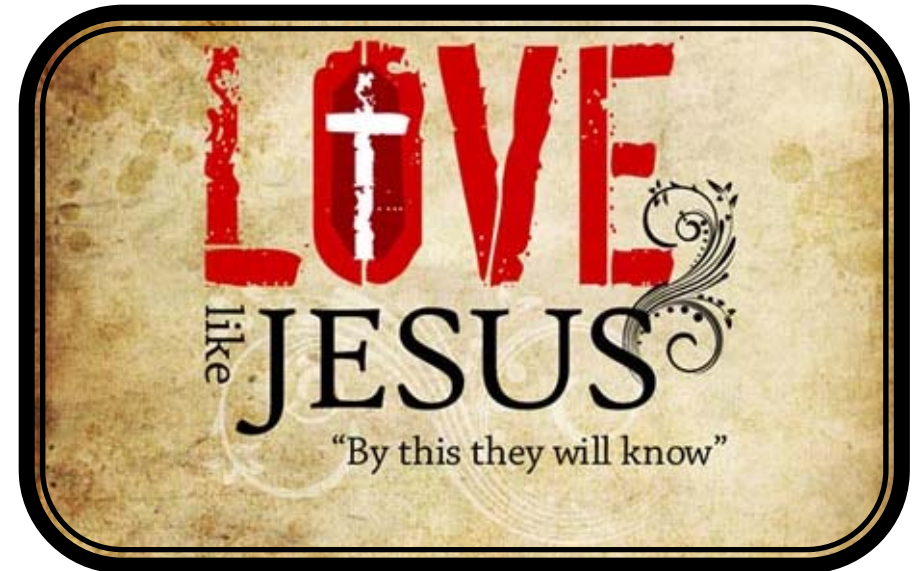
“Wisdom is that quality that enables one to live a noticeably, recognizably outstanding life. It is skill in the art of living with each facet of life under God’s authority.”

Wisdom (*noun*) — the quality or state of being wise; knowledge of what is true or right coupled with just judgment as to action; sagacity, discernment, or insight.

“Walk in wisdom toward outsiders, making the best use of the time.” (Colossians 4:5)

It’s one thing to have courage by faith. The next step is to gain wisdom from it’s only true source, God! In 2017, there are a variety of tools available to help us do just that.

LOVING SERVICE



“Whatever zealous things Christians might accomplish are in vain without an attitude of loving service”

Loving Service (*noun*) — having a profoundly tender, passionate affection for another person while rendering an act of helpful activity; help; aid

Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord. (Romans 12:11)

When we see as God sees, we will do as God says. Love for God is the supreme quality of the Christian heart. When it’s ignited with zealous service, your spiritual fire will shine beautifully against the darkness of sin. You must be willing to see as God sees and do as God says.

COURAGE



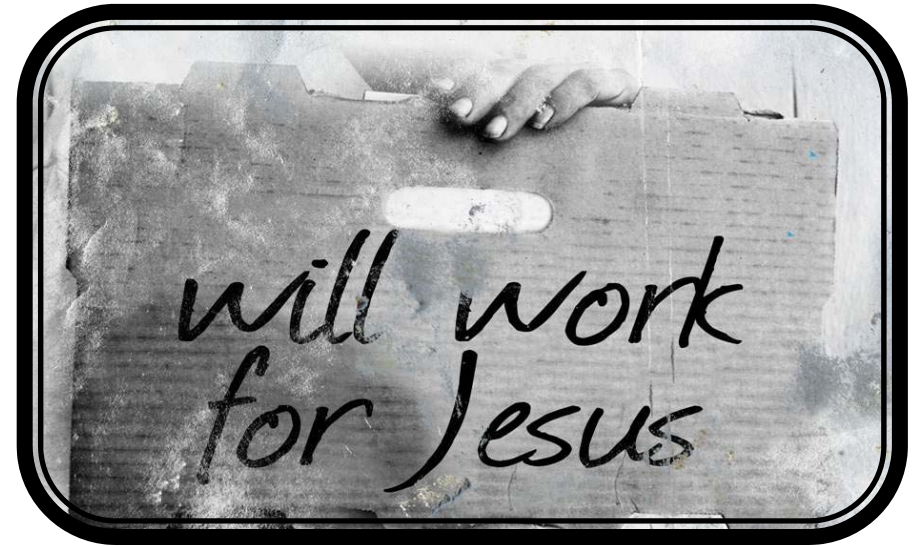
“Courage is the difference between listening to Goliath mock God from the sidelines and David’s faith to fight.”

Courage (*noun*) — mental or moral strength to venture, persevere, and withstand danger, fear, or difficulty.

“Now who is there to harm you if you are zealous for what is good? (1 Peter 3:13)

God doesn’t simply command courage with no reason behind it. In nearly every incident where God says “fear not”, there follows a reason to have courage and that reason is God Himself, His nature and His perfect plans. Knowing that God is protecting and guiding us, we can have courage because we are confident in Him.

ENERGY



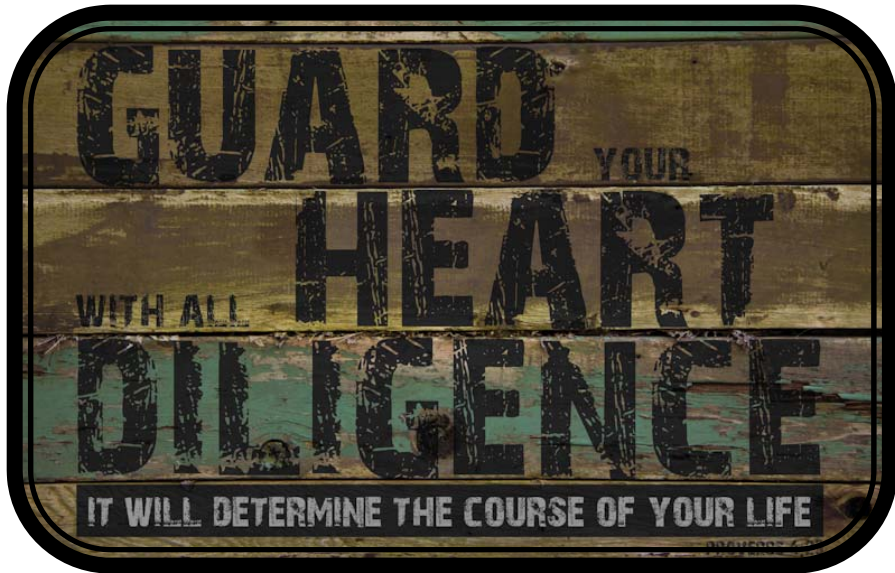

Energy (*noun*) — the capacity of vigorous activity; available, adequate or abundant power

“Him we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone with all wisdom, that we may present everyone mature in Christ. For this I toil, struggling with all his energy that he powerfully works within me.” (Colossians 1:28-29)

DILIGENCE



“Diligent Christians reject laziness, plan for the future, partner with godly people and take advantage of opportunities to bring glory to God.

Diligence (noun) — earnest effort to accomplish what is undertaken; persistent exertion of body or mind.

Whatever is decreed by the God of heaven, let it be done in full (zeal)... (Ezra 7:23)

God values diligence in His people. Diligence is investing our time and energy to complete each task assigned to us. Diligence is accepting each task as a special assignment from the Lord and using all our energies to do it quickly and skillfully.

Faith-Fueled

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. ²For by it the people of old received their commendation. ³By faith we understand that the universe was created by the word of God, so that what is seen was not made out of things that are visible.

⁴By faith Abel offered to God a more acceptable sacrifice than Cain, through which he was commended as righteous, God commending him by accepting his gifts. And through his faith, though he died, he still speaks. ⁵By faith Enoch was taken up so that he should not see death, and he was not found, because God had taken him. Now before he was taken he was commended as having pleased God. ⁶And without faith it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him.

(Heb. 11:1-6)

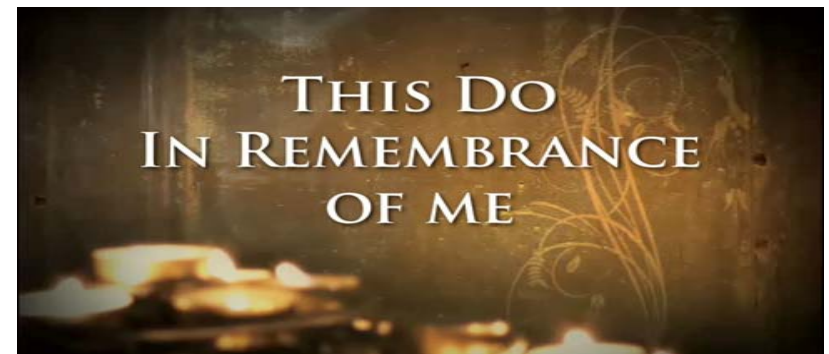
