- (1) "Dragon" 21 times in OT
- (2) "Dragon" 12 times in NT

(1) A great fish swallows the prophet Jonah

Book of Job

- (1) Alfred Lord Tennyson
- (2) Victor Hugo
- (3) Satan appears with the sons of God

Job 1:21 and 2:10

- (1) <u>Job lost his vast wealth</u>
- (2) Job lost his family
- (3) Job lost his good health
- (4) Job's faith is strong (in the beginning of his ordeal)

Job 7:3 and 13:15

(1) Job: Is God responsible for all that has happened to me?

Where Were You when I laid the Foundations of the Earth?

- (1) God proceeds to answer Job
- (2) God reveals to Job how little he knew about the earth and its environment.
- (3) Job is in no position to answer.

<u>Whirlwind</u>

(1) God begins a second round speaking to Job.

<u>Behemoth</u>

- (1) Job chapter 40
- (2) This enormous creature living at the same time and in the same region as Job.
- (3) God was not showing Job a vision
- (4) Behemoth and Job could see each other.

<u>Leviathan</u>

(1) Job 41:1-34

DINOSAURS ARE CONTROVERSIAL

In case you wondered about these things:

- (1) Are they merely mythological fantasies of antiquity?
- (2) Did dinosaurs eat man?
- (3) Did Adam name the dinosaurs?
- (4) When did the dinosaurs die?
- (5) Dinosaurs: Too big for Noah's Ark?

Dinosaurs: Myths or Symbols?

(1) The Bible says David, Nehemiah, Isaiah, and the Apostle Paul supported the Genesis narrative of God's creation.

Bible Timeline (Sixth Day of Creation)

- (1) God made the beasts of the earth after his kind.
- (2) That would include dinosaurs.

Behemoth: Hippopotamus?

- (1) ...exaggerated features borrowed from the hippopotamus.
- (2) Behemoth ranked "chief" of the Lord's creatures (Job 40:19).

Leviathan: Crocodile?

- (1) None is so fierce that dare stir him up...
- (2) ...Egyptians tamed the crocodile and adorned it with jewelry.

Genesis 1:29-30

(1) There were no meat eaters in the original creation

Genesis 2:20

(1) God brought every living creature to Adam to see what he would call them:

When Did the Dinosaurs Die?

- (1) Evolutionists say dinosaurs died out 65 million years ago.
- (2) Creationists say adding up the genealogies of Adam to Jesus do not equal millions of years.
- (3) Appearance of Age: God created the earth to look old?
- (4) Radiocarbon 14 Dating.

Bible Timeline (Noah Lived After the Flood)

- (3) Eliphaz refers to the flood as being in the past (Job 22:16)
- (4) Job sacrifices to God as head of his family (Job 1:5)
- (5) Job's wealth is determined by flocks rather than money (Job 1:3, 42:12)

Dinosaurs: Too Big for the Ark?

- (1) Behemoth survived.
- (2) Reasonable to assume that juvenile dinosaurs or dinosaur eggs were boarded on the ark.

Job's Court of Law with God

- (1) There are at least 60 questions from God to Job.
- (2) Job does not answer to any of them.
- (3) Job had no clear concept of God's power and glory.
- (4) Isaiah calls attention to man's lack of knowledge about the time and nature of the true God (Isaiah 40:21).

Dr. Don Patton

- (1) Graduate of Florida College (1963)
- (2) Dig sits in Colorado, Texas, Wyoming, and Canada.
- (3) Preacher of the gospel for over 40 years.
- (4) Dinosaurs co-existed with man.

Cave Paintings in Zimbabwe

- (1) Representations of the elephant, giraffe, and brontosaurus.
- (2) Bushmen are known to have painted from real life.

Paluxy Riverbed in Texas

(1) Dozens of human footprints along with dinosaur tracks reported along this riverbed in Texas.

WHAT CAN WE LEARN FROM BEHEMOTH AND LEVIATHAN?

Few animals are recorded in the Bible with such detailed descriptions as recorded in Job chapters 40 and 41.

Genesis 2:6

- (1) Earth covered by a mist.
- (2) God's creation unblemished, living in perfect harmony, eating only plants.

No Death in the Creation

- (1) Genesis 1:29-30 & 2:17.
- (2) 1st Corinthians 15.
- (3) Hebrews 9:22.
- (4) Revelation 21:14 & 22:3.

Death Now an Intruder

- (1) Romans 5:12
- (2) Romans 8:22
- (3) Last enemy to be destroyed (1 Corinthians 15:26)

Genesis Chapter 7

- (1) In his book <u>Creation vs Evolution</u>, Dr. James A. Hodges has a chapter entitled "*Historical Evidence for Noah's Ark and Flood."*
- (2) Dr. Hodges and other Bible scholars believe that most dinosaurs drowned or were suffocated in the mud from the raging waters during the Flood as described in Genesis chapter 7.
- (3) Quick burial approximately 4,500 years ago.
- (4) Fossils of many living things found throughout the world.

<u>Climate Change</u>

- (1) The Flood is the best explanation for the loss of the Eden-like environment as described in Genesis chapters one and two.
- (2) "Fountains of the deep" forged mountain ranges and carved deep canyons (Genesis 7:11).
- (3) Destruction of habitats
- (4) "Every moving thing that liveth shall be meat for you" (Genesis 9:3).

READ THE BOOK OF JOB

Job lost everything at the hand of Satan—his friends and even his wife tells him to curse God and die.

- (1) Job's suffering the result of some hideous, secret sin?
- (2) Job's confession to God: I know that you can do all things, and that no purpose of yours can be questioned.
- (3) No one is not righteous enough to know God's divine plan "As it is written, there is none righteous..." (Romans 10:10-11)

Job's Repentance

- (1) His health is restored
- (2) His riches are doubled (14,000 sheep, 6,000 camels, 1,0000 yoke of oxen, 1,000 donkeys.)
- (3) He has seven new sons and three new daughters.
- (4) Satan is defeated.
- (5) Job lives on for another 140 years—seeing see his descendants to the fourth generation and dying peacefully.

God's Plan of Salvation

- (1) Dinosaurs are extinct— but God's Plan of Salvation is not.
- (2) Noah spent 120 years building the ark. Yet no one was saved from the flood except his own family.
- (3) Christ's church is over 2,000 years old and counting. And yet the end could be later this hour.

<u>1 Peter 2:9</u>

- (1) Job lived at a time when he could see behemoth.
- (2) We live in a time when dinosaur bones and the surface of Mars are easily viewed on our laptop computers.
- (3) It is all part of a look at God's creation—and a preview of what we can expect to see when we get to heaven.
- (4) The power and the glory of God.
- (5) We see all these things—and we have the complete Bible.
- (6) (We are) "...a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for God's own possession..."

Hebrews 4:15

- (1) Job never lost faith in God.
- (2) (Jesus) "...tempted in every way, just as we are—yet he did not sin."

No Generation Will Have All the Answers

- (1) Including discussions about dinosaurs.
- (2) But to the Christian, whether physical evidence is found or not, it does not change the fact that through faith, we believe that the Bible is the Word of God.
- (3) Hebrews 11:1 ("...the evidence of things not seen.")
- (4) Hebrews chapter 1 (summary of basic truths for us.)

<u>Rebellion</u>

- (1) This lesson is about God's creation.
- (2) God is the judge of it.
- (3) Adam and Eve's rebellion brought sin and death in the world.
- (4) God judged the rebellion in Noah's day with water.
- (5) God will judge the world again with fire (2 Peter 3:10.)
