
PRAYER



Lesson Five: The Psalms Teach Christians How to Pray

The Book of Psalm was the inspired prayer and praise book of the Old Testament. Of the 238 direct quotations from the Old Testament in the New Testament, 116 of them are from the Psalms. It was the second most often quoted Old Testament book by Jesus. It is a versatile book dealing with every

The Psalms are models of devotion, sources of doctrine, songs of comfort and hope, and prayers of righteous men. The Psalms are men speaking to God about the things that God had already spoken to man. Prayer is pleading the promises of God. They show us how to effectively and acceptably praise and pray to God. They also can be used effectively to teach and minister to others. It is important that we learn to "speak God's language" as we

communicate with Him. We can do this by saturating our minds with scripture (Col. 3:16-17. Cultivate the habit of pleading the promises of God (Psalm 143:1) Use all Bible prayers as models of your own, not just the Psalms. Consider Paul's prayer in Colossians 1:9-12.

THE BIBLE USE OF PSALMS IN PRAYER
