Introduction:

A. Heaven is place prepared for those who are prepared - Heb. 11:13-16

- 1. 73% Americans believe in life after death; 62% believe in hell. (Pewresearch.org)
- 2. "This World Is Not My Home" Reflects faith.

"This world is not my home I'm just a passing through; My treasures are laid up somewhere beyond the blue; The angels beckon me from heaven's open door, And I can't feel at home in this world anymore."

3. "Everybody Wants to Go to Heaven" (Kenny Chesney) - Reflects worldliness and unbelief.

"Preacher told me last Sunday mornin'

'Son, you better start livin' right;

You need to quit the women and whiskey,

And carrying on all night.

Don't you wanna hear him call your name,

When you're standin' at the pearly gates?

I told the preacher, 'Yes I do,

But I hope they don't call today;

I ain't ready.'

Everybody wants to go to heaven,

Have a mansion high above the clouds;

Everybody wants to go to heaven,

But nobody wants to go now.

Someday I want to see those streets of gold in my halo.

But I wouldn't mind waitin' at least a hundred years or so."

- B. Two things to consider today:
 - 1. The world does not know heaven.
 - a. Misinformed, trivialized, mythologized,
 - b. This lesson gives us an opportunity to help them.
 - 2. The world would rather remain in this world.
 - a. Some Christians, too.

I. LIFE IN THIS WORLD DETERMINES ETERNITY

A. Gal. 6:7-9; Rom. 2:5-10

- 1. We all stumble in this life, but only those who fail to repent will miss heaven Luke 13:3; 1Peter 4:3-5
- 2. Some actually prefer to enjoy sin for a season in this world, rather than an eternity in heaven Heb. 11:24-26
- 3. "An act that rejects immediate gratification in favor of long-term grown, health, or integrity is an act that derives from our high nature instead of our lower." (Steven Pressfield, The Art of War)
- 4. "Quick gratification of desires, often lead to low stratifications in life." (Constance Friday)

- 5. Psalm 84:10
- B. God calls the righteous, inviting them into His heaven Matt 25:20-21, 34
 - 1. The righteous anticipate hearing the call Phil. 1:21-23
 - 2. The unrighteous do not expect to be summoned from life Luke 12:20
 - 3. The first is prepared, not suicidal; the second is deliberately oblivious, not sophisticated Psalm 52:5-9, 39:4-7
- C. Desire to go to heaven is not the same thing as having a hope of heaven. 1. Matt. 7:21-23; Rom. 8:18-19, 24-25
- D. Jesus promised dwellings in heaven for the faithful John 14:1-3
 - 1. The world has a different order of priorities -- Heaven later, world now -it will end in no heaven later - 1John 2:15-17; Matt. 6:33
 - 2. The righteous have a Divine set of priorities: dismiss the world and embrace the hope of heaven Luke 9:22-25; Gal. 2:20

II. ETERNITY MUST SHAPE LIFE IN THIS WORLD

A. Eph. 5:14-17 - The righteous are in a hurry to prepare for heaven.

- 1. The unrighteous postpone preparation for heaven in lieu of pleasure in this world Amos 6:3-7; Matt. 24:48-51
- B. The righteous long for the true heaven Rev. 21:22-27, 22:1-5
 - 1. The righteous are shaping their lives right now to be ready. a. 2Cor. 4:16-18; 2Tim. 4:6-8; Matt. 5:29-30
 - 2. Heaven and hell are real; nobody wants to go to hell; yet, most are living for it Rom. 2:5
 - 3. The majority are making this choice Matt. 7:13-14

- A. Do you want to go to heaven? If you really what to go, you will do something about it now.
